1. 2022, 2023 IEC/R projection

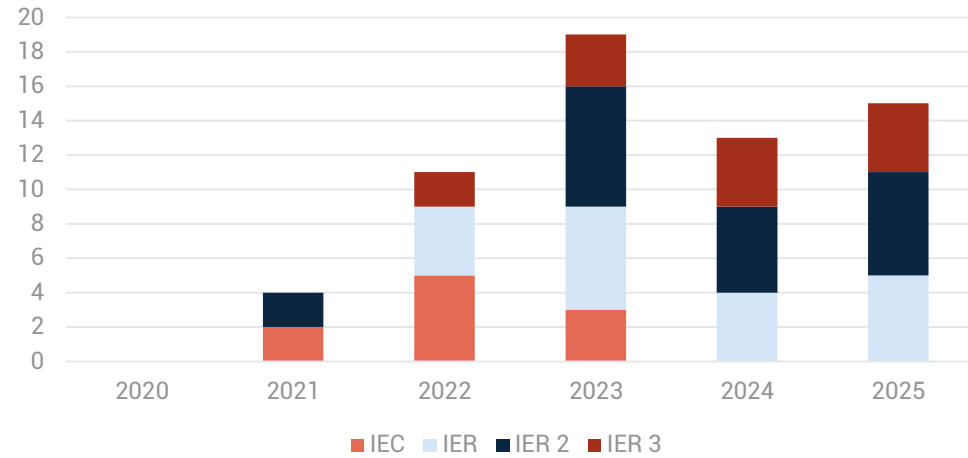
2. Backlog situation – Challenges:

a) IEC as priority – ISG 2021 guidance –

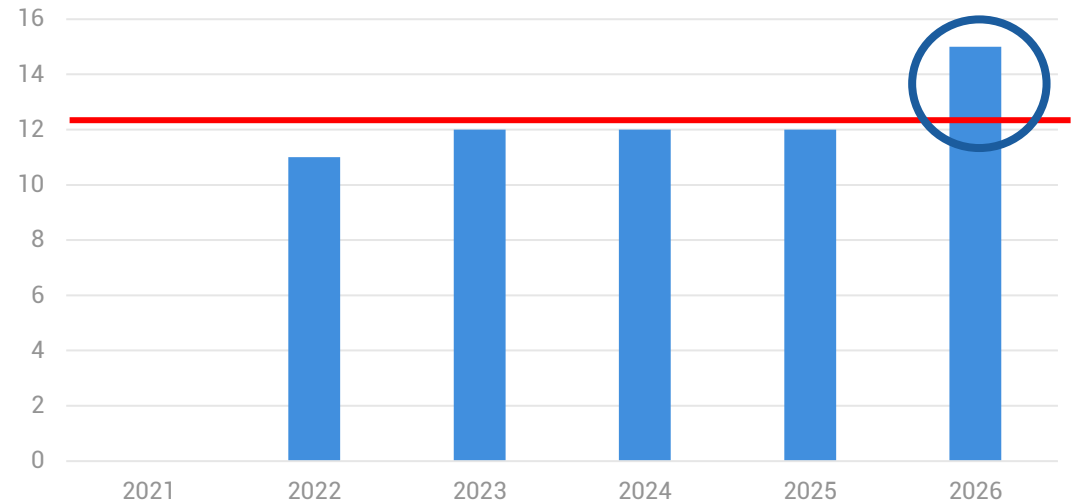
b) Prioritize backlog of IERs(20), and IECs.

ISG-Approved 2-year Extension

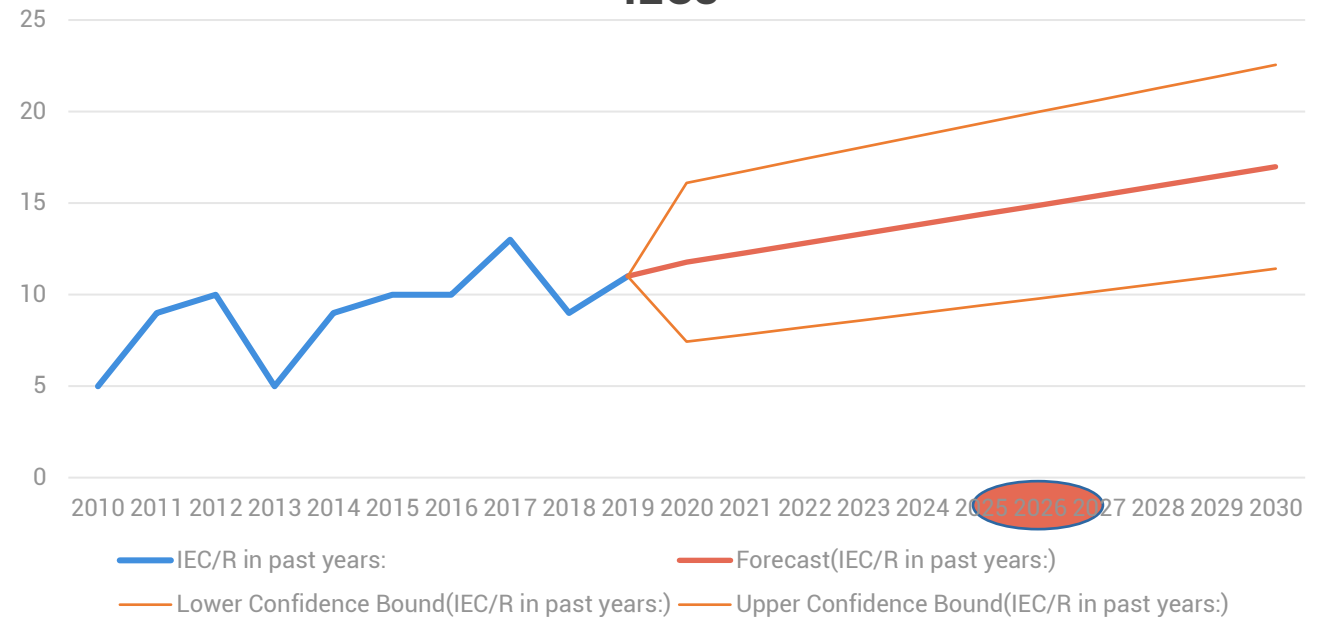


# 6. IEC/Rs Plan - Management of IERs from 2022 onwards

## Recommendations:

1. Secretariat will soon inform teams with slots for 2023, 2024.
2. TWG organises an IEC/R Leadership Training in the Netherlands.
3. WGs invited to review and propose a lighter system for IERs.
