INSARAG EXTERNAL CLASSIFICATION


Overview

As of 1 December 2023

The INSARAG External Classification (IEC) system is a global recognition accorded to Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) teams with a mandate to deploy internationally when requested by member countries in major earthquakes and collapse building emergencies.

Having teams classified according to a globally accepted standard will enable disaster affected countries to prioritise acceptance of international response support from USAR Teams who can add proven value to their national capacity. INSARAG External Re-classification (IER) are required every five yearly for classified teams to demonstrate their operational capabilities.

The IEC is a unique independent, verifiable, voluntary peer review process that has received unanimous global acceptance with over 60 IECs and 100 IERs successfully conducted to date in 50 countries.






INSARAG EXTERNAL CLASSIFICATIONS (IEC) AND RECLASSIFICATIONS (IEC/R) by year and level











1. Reclassification 2. Second reclassification 3. Third reclassification




















